Guidelines and conditions

HTANSW will endeavour to create a rich and diverse program drawing on as many submissions as possible. Depending on the quantity and nature of submissions, however, we cannot guarantee that all proposals will be accepted. To prepare your submission, please carefully read the following:

Session Options	
Presentation 45-50 mins	Most presentations will be offered in this standard format on each day of the conference. Session length will be specified once the program is drafted but will be approximately 45-50 minutes.
Other Format	The conference committee will consider proposals for other formats, e.g., panels, short sessions or displays. These should be discussed with HTANSW prior to formal submission.

- HTANSW welcomes proposals on all aspects of the NSW Stage 4-6 syllabuses.
- We also hope to offer presentations on a range of other topics, including but not limited to: historical thinking, innovative pedagogies in History, digital history (e.g. AI), leading a History/HSIE department and Elective History.
- This conference will not include sessions on History in the primary curriculum.
- Submissions are to be made using Google Forms and require a referee – use the link provided below. Should a proposal be accepted, the information provided on the proposal form will be used to produce presenter profiles and abstracts for the conference program. Please ensure that this information is accurate and is typed in concise prose that will give conference attendees a clear outline of what will be covered, should your submission be successful. Titles, bios and synopses for accepted presentations may require editing, in collaboration with HTANSW.
- By submitting a proposal, you are indicating that you would be willing and available to present on *either day* of the conference. Once the call for papers closes, a program will be drafted to ensure the sessions demonstrate variety and balance between stages and courses (e.g., Ancient and Modern History) across both days.
- All rooms will have data projector facilities – further details will be provided to successful applicants.
- Internet access cannot be guaranteed at the venue. If your proposed session requires an internet connection, please make this explicit in the proposed session synopsis.
- Group presentations will be limited to a maximum of two presenters.
- Presenters will be offered free conference registration for the day they are presenting, with a limit of two free registrations per session for that day when there is more than one presenter. There will be no discounted registration for panel members.
- Proposals for more than one session will be considered, but may not all be accepted.
- Ensure that all contact details remain current prior to the conference. We will rely on prompt email communication and confirmation throughout the development of the program.
